
SUBJECT: ALLOTMENT OF GOVERNMENT ACCOMMODATION UNDER RULE 15 OF ACCOMMODATION ALLOCATION RULES, 2002.

Dear Sir,

In supersession of this Ministry's letter of even number dated 25.6.2008, I am directed to state that in compliance with the Supreme Court's Judgment dated 03.8.2009 in W.P. No. 1009 of 2009, the competent authority has decided to initiate cases for allotment of Government accommodation under Rule 15 of Accommodation Allocation Rules, 2002 as per following details:-

- i. The accommodation allotted to retired/deceased Federal Government Servant will only be allotted to his serving children/spouse subject to entitlement and provided that the beneficiary was in government service during the permissible retention period of 6 months and one year respectively.
- ii. The serving spouse/children of the retired/deceased FGS shall not be allotted accommodation of higher category under Rule 15 of AAR-2002 and such accommodation shall be got vacated after expiry of grace period of six months and one year as the case may be.
- iii. They shall apply for accommodation of their entitlement. They shall be registered in General Waiting List under Rule 6 of AAR-2002 and shall be allotted first available accommodation of their entitlement.
- iv. Estate Office is requested to take further necessary action in the matter accordingly and submit the cases to this Ministry for approval of the competent authority.
- v. This has the approval of Minister for Housing and Works.
